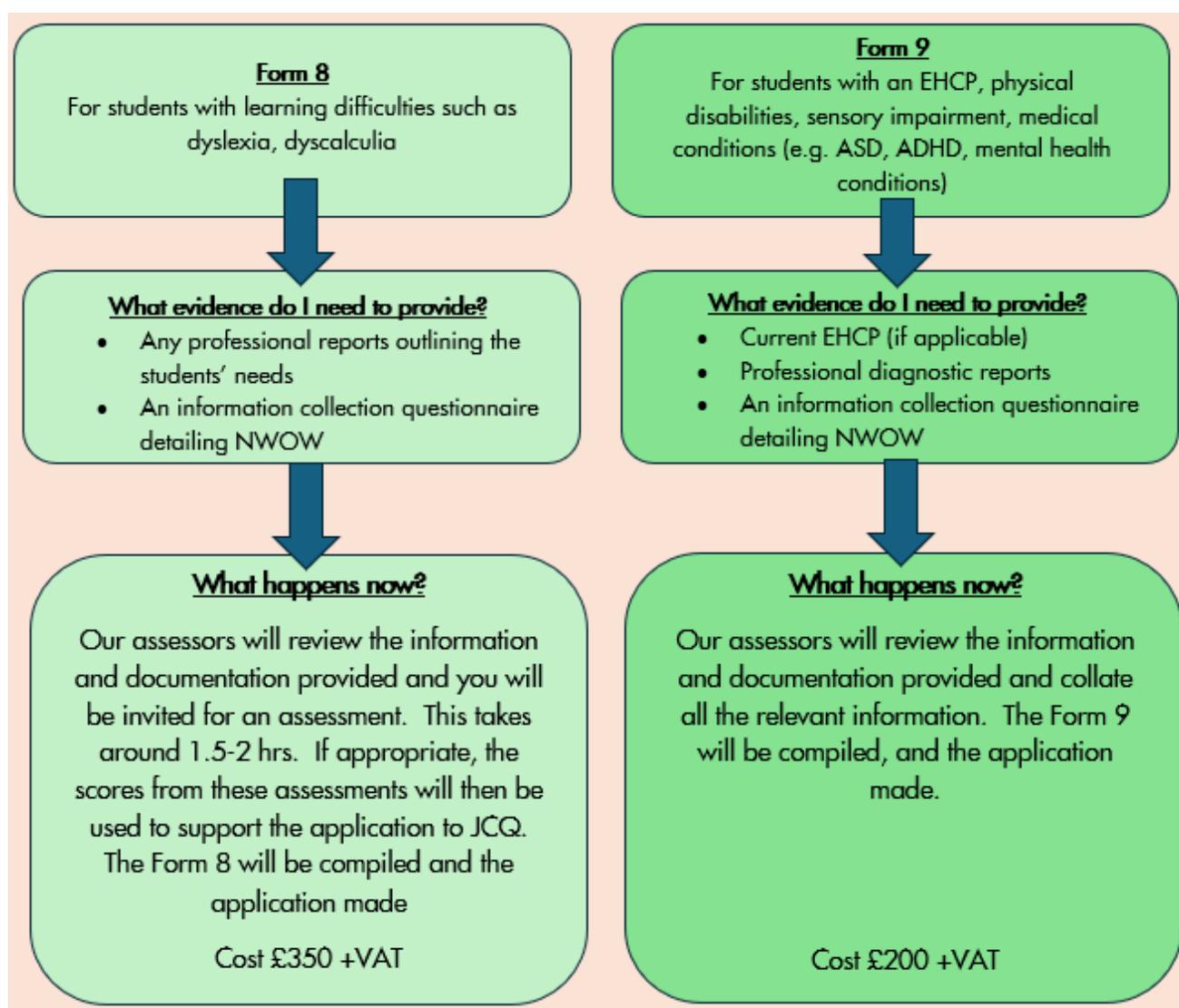


Access Arrangements for Examinations

We understand the importance of ensuring that all candidates have fair and appropriate access to their exams, and we are committed to supporting those who require access arrangements. The rules and regulations around exam access arrangements (EAA) are set by JCQ and we as a centre are bound by these.

If you believe that your child may require reasonable adjustments in their exams, please read the information below carefully.

There are two routes for applying for EAA dependent on the evidence of need and normal way of working (NWOW) in the current setting.



Access Arrangements available for external candidates at Frewen College.



- Up to 25 % extra time (additional evidence will be required in the form of mock papers with the use of a different colour pen to evidence use of extra time. This must be provided before an application can be made)
- Reader (an adult assigned to a group, pupils must raise their hand to ask for questions to be read)
- Computer reader
- Reading pen
- Word processor (with or without spelling/grammar check enabled)
- Supervised rest breaks
- Prompter

If you wish to pursue an application for EAA, please follow the steps below:

Step 1:

Complete the form on pages 3-7 and return to the assessors;

Please include as much detail as possible.

Step 2:

Our EAA assessors will review your information and contact you to confirm whether a form 8 or form 9 will be needed.

Step 3:

Once you have received confirmation from our assessors, an invoice will be raised, and payment must be made within 48hrs. Upon receipt of payment, we will contact you with further details of a face-to-face assessment appointment if necessary. PLEASE NOTE, **we have limited assessment slots, if payment is not received the slot will be released.**

Step 4:

Following review and collation of the information provided, and assessment where necessary, our assessors will complete the relevant form which will then be processed by the exam officer.

Step 5:

Agreed access arrangements will be confirmed and in place for your exams.
